Rodd asked Diana if they call safe data. Diana/Carolyn will look into it.

Rodd (SSC) has no database, but he can ask customer service staff.

It was recommended that they put a link to state law or RCW.

Rodd recommending build a plan of databases and maintain it.

Brandi would like to see more construction debris and remodeling.

Rodd said in bullet point number 4 it covers organics and construction debris.

Overall recycling program

#### 4.1 - No changes

##### 4.1.1

Added the WCC8.10.50(A)

In Table 4.1 in Bin Location changed to from Newspaper Red Bin to Bin #1 and added mixed white paper.

Changed Scrap Paper to Bin #2.

Changed Containers Blue to Bin #4 and added bi-metal

Added language Outside of Bins and added Cardboard (flattened on its side) and Brown paper bags.

Added language Effective January 1, 2019, single family residences with on-site sewage systems that are located in Point Roberts are no longer exempt from mandatory curbside collection services. As a minimum level of service, curbside collection consists of 26 annual pickups as defined in WCC 9.10.04(D). The cost of the minimum level of service, per the approved UTC tariff, is billed as annual fee on the properties tax bill. Service level above the minimum level of service are billed directly by service provider.

Added in organizations like Sustainable Connection

Also removed some language.

Rodd would like bins types back to the way they were. Maybe add a foot note on the different bins and put different colors back. Mixed white paper does not go in bins.

Erik can add a link in the document to a website about the different bins.

Larry asked Diana how many communities use three bins. Diana said Jefferson does three bins. Nooksack Valley and SSC do it differently.

Added Medication Recycling language.

Added Paint Recycling language.

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**SIGNIFICANT POINTS OR EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Whatcom County Code 24.07, *Administrative Notice Proceedings, Civil Penalties and Abatement*, states that “the county may institute a civil suit in any court of appropriate jurisdiction for the collection of any civil penalty imposed, for the cost of any work of abatement, and/or for its administrative costs pursuant to this chapter, against any person whose violation or violations of a health regulation resulted in the penalty, the abatement, or the costs. The civil penalty, the cost of abatement, and the administrative costs are also joint and several personal obligations of any person in violation,” and, “WCHD shall have a lien for any civil penalty imposed, the cost of any work of abatement, and/or its administrative costs which may be foreclosed and enforced in the civil suit authorized by this chapter against the real property on which the civil penalty was imposed, the administrative cost incurred, or any of the work of abatement was performed.”

Solid waste staff are in consideration of establishing a fund specifically to be used for properties with active solid waste complaints, where an extreme violation of a public health regulation exists, and all existing avenues of mitigating the health violation have been exhausted to no effect.

The fund would serve to abate violations of health regulations, and would be replenished upon sale of the property and collection of the lien.

Staff will present the program and seek input regarding use of the program as a compliance enforcement tool.
